



## Social 30-1

Social 30-1 is offered as an **individualized learning** course at the Learning Centres. The teacher is accessible for support via email or by booking an [appointment](#) (phone, virtual meeting, in person) during our hours of operation. Before you ask for help on the assignment, be sure to review all available resources including the practice problems on the course Google Site.

Students will complete the course by working through modules. Modules are comprised of lessons which include various resources that allow the student to actively engage in the learning process. Course content and resources are provided online through the course website. Students require their unique [@edu.sturgeon.ab.ca](mailto:@edu.sturgeon.ab.ca) account for course completion.

### Progression Through Course Sequences

Prerequisites: Successful completion of Social 20-1 or 30-2

There are no prerequisites for mature students. A mature student, for Alberta High School Diploma purposes, is one who as of September 1 of the current school year, is 19 years of age or older; or the holder of a previously-awarded high school diploma from the province of Alberta; or an equivalent high school diploma from a jurisdiction acceptable to the Minister.



Note: Students generally take the prerequisites in a course sequence (e.g., English Language Arts 10-1, 20-1, 30-1). This route is designated by solid arrows. However, Alberta Education recognizes that students may transfer between course sequences and those recommended routes are designated by broken arrows. The school authority shall have a policy that clearly states the criteria to be met by a student who wishes to change program routes.

You are required to write a diploma exam to earn credit in the course. It is worth 20% of your mark. It is written on set dates in November, January, April, June and August.
